



YOUR ITIN COULD BE EXPIRED!

A new IRS law requires some taxpayers to renew their ITIN*

*An Individual Tax Identification Number (ITIN) is a number issued by the IRS to help individuals who cannot obtain a Social Security number file their taxes.

Is your ITIN expired?



All ITINs issued before 2013 will begin expiring this year, starting with those with middle digits of 78 and 79 (Example: (9XX-78-XXXX)).



All ITINs not used on a federal tax return at least once in the last three years will also expire.

If you have an expired ITIN...



You may be ineligible for certain tax credits.



You will not receive a refund until the expired ITIN has been renewed.



Renew your ITIN now:

Complete and submit a Form W-7 application by the end of 2016 to avoid tax credit delays. Download the forms at the links below.
